Short description of the course

The cycle of 12 lectures sets the task of introducing students to the main problems of Byzantine and Slavic codicology and paleography. Theoretical and informational lectures are combined with practical activities and work *de visu* with medieval Greek and Slavonic manuscripts from the collection of the Ivan Duychev Center and other repositories in Sofia. In parallel, the peculiarities of the Greek and Slavic handwritten codes, the types of script and the genetic connection of the Slavic alphabets (Glagolitic and Cyrillic) to the Greek tradition are presented. Students will be able to familiarize themselves with the history of the handwritten book and writing

materials, analyze in detail the structure of the handwritten book, the elements of its decoration, the types of books, and their connection to church ritual. Special attention is paid to dating of manuscripts according to their watermarks. The relationship between ornaments, the miniature on the one hand and the text on the other will be examined. The process of making bindings and their decoration will be also presented.

- The status of the manuscript in the Orthodox world. *Corpus Areopagiticum* and its important in the elaboration of the Theory of the Holy Images.
- **From Scroll to Codex - How the Bible Became a Book.** Pragmatic and ideological preconditions
- Basic materials for writing and their production - papyrus, wax, parchment, paper.
- Design of the book body. Assembly of Quires. Gregory's rule for parchment manuscripts. Watermarks in paper manuscripts.
- Types of script in 4-6 s. The iconoclastic period in Byzantium. The substitution of the majuscule with minuscule. The Studion monastery I n Constantinople.
- The two Slavonic Alphabets. The substitution of the Glagolitic with Cyrillic script. The Cyrillic alphabet as graphic redaction of the Greek majuscule.
- Elements of the manuscript decoration. The main terms and their use.
- The main styles in manuscript decoration and their connection with the use of the code or with the order.
- Graphical separation of the text depending on the liturgical use of the code.
- The social function of the book - the manuscripts of the great luxury, monastery manuscripts and manuscripts for personal use.
- Basic types of books in terms of their content.
- When the manuscript speaks for himself - notes, bindings, etc.
