Short description of the course (in the language of instruction):

The expected outcomes will be the acquisition of both knowledge and cognitive competences:

First, the students will know in substantive details the evolutionary nature of the politics of EU's enlargement to Central, Eastern and South-Eastern Countries carried out by pre- and post-accession conditionality – the political framework, the premises, the tool-box, the successes and failures of the conditionality in the fields of economic and political integration of the EU. Besides, they will be capable to recognize the implicit political approach of the Eastern Enlargement.

Second, the students will be trained in group work on deconstructing the study process as interplay between specific political subject-matters and analytical methodologies. The end result is supposed to be their ability for autonomous research work needed for their MA thesis and, eventually, PhD thesis preparation.

The core objectives of the course are twofold. The first it is designed to acquaint the students with the evolution and unfolding of EU enlargement process and some of the main factors that drove this process forward. Secondly, the course introduced the students with the EU institutional features in their connection with the institutional politics which accompanied and shaped the enlargement process.

Short description of the course (in the language of instruction):

The course focuses on the current challenges before the EU enlargement policy towards the Western Balkan countries, and also on the EU neighborhood policy.

The analysis begins with the implications of the Eastern enlargements of 2004 and 2007. They are followed by the regional characteristics of the Western Balkan countries in view of the events subsequent to the disintegration of Yugoslavia. Next on the syllabus is a review of the new challenges for the EU in the region, presented with the membership prospects and relevant reports for each individual state. Croatia receives special attention as the first Western Balkan country to accede to the EU on 1 July 2013.

The second part of the course focuses on the history and development of the EU neighborhood policy. Its main instruments are also a subject of analysis. Considering the differences between the regions within the framework of this policy, each of them is examined separately. The Eastern Partnership countries are considered first, followed by the countries in the Middle East. Finally, we examine the North African countries.

Short description of the course (in the language of instruction):

Bulgaria, alongside with the other 27 member states, is constantly involved in the work of the institutions of the European Union, in adopting political decisions and formulating the future EU policies. In order to properly defend the national priorities within the enlarged Union, it is of key importance to know in detail the functioning mechanisms of the EU, the coordination of European affairs in the national administrations as well as the opportunities for the countries to influence the EU decision-making process. These are the basic questions of the academic course. Democratic accountability, on the other hand, is a key legitimising factor for the institutions of the EU, including the European Commission and the Council of the EU. The European Council is also of major importance in the agenda setting. By studying its accountability as a collective body (on European level) and individually (on national level) students receive useful knowledge for the multilevel governance in the EU and the role of the member states in the overall process. The course makes an overview and summarises the students' knowledge of the EU institutions, the new executive order after the Treaty of Lisbon and the decision-making process in the EU. We analyse thoroughly the participation of the national institutions in the EU affairs coordination mechanism and in the process of making and accepting political decisions in the EU. The course puts an emphasis upon the influence of the non-government institutions and organisations, as well as the role of the EU consultative bodies in the decision-making process. We also focus on the infringement procedure in the EU.

The academic course focuses on elaborating several practical classes. The first refers to the step-by-step process of preparing an official member state position in a Working group of the Council of the EU. The second practical exercise is about discussing a draft for Directive in the Council of the EU in Brussels. The third case is about understanding democratic accountability and political control of the EU institutions. The main aim of the practical exercises is to give examples of how the EU affairs coordination mechanism and the decision-making process work, as well as obtaining negotiating skills. The syllabus is finalised with two discussions, in the form of debates, on two main topics: a) what type of EU affairs coordination mechanism is applied, b) is there a need for reform regarding the decision-making process in the EU.

If any, please describe the specific requirements: The students are supposed to have preliminary preparation and accumulated basic knowledge of the overall institutional framework of the EU, as well as to be acquainted with the reforms after the entry into force of the Treaty of Lisbon.
