**Short description of the course (in the language of instruction):** The course is designed to introduce students to both politics and political science. It provides an overview of the basic methodologies of political science: methodological individualism, structuralism, constructivism. The course has a part, which is on the history of ideas: it explains basic concepts and acquaints the students with the main political thinkers since antiquity. The course also has a section on the machinery of government, where the students explore the functioning of political regimes, the role of political parties, presidents and parliaments, as well as the different models of governance. Finally, the course deals with issues as democracy and democratisation, politics in a globalised world, and supranational politics.

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| <p><b>Short description of the course (in the language of instruction):</b> Non-public politics analyses the drawbacks of the public nature of politics. This problem includes both (i) political actions and decisions which remain invisible for the general public and (ii) conspicuous political actions stimulated by secret political motives. Therefore, hidden political goals could be achieved through public mobilization of politicians, parties, institutions and even large groups of citizens. | <p><b>Short description of the course (in the language of instruction):</b> This course consists of two parts. The first one presents some epistemological problems of political anthropology, its main approaches, and topics. The second one offers an original anthropological approach to the politics of Modernity. It asks three fundamental questions: Which relations are public? How these relations transform into political ones? Which is the role of citizens' publics in this process? In answering these questions, this course substantiates that both public sphere and political institutions are rooted in the opinion exchange between strangers. **Short description of the course (in the language of instruction):**

The course is divided into 4 parts:

1. Theoretical and methodological approaches to the study of European political integration.
2. EU Common Foreign Policy - institutional framework, objectives, instruments, with an emphasis on the current setting, after the Lisbon Treaty.
3. Review of the development of the CFSP after the end of the Cold War. There will be seminars devoted to study of the most important bilateral relations of the EU – with the USA, Russia, China, Turkey.
4. EU Common Security Policy - structure, civilian and military resources, analysis of past missions, prospects for future development (the introduction of PESCO, enhanced co-operation in Intelligence, etc.).

**Short description of the course:** This course analyses the connection between religion, politics and security. It has three main goals. First of all, the course interprets the connection by describing several case studies - France, U.K., Greece, Turkey, India, etc. Second, the course emphasizes on most of the world's religions by analyzing their connection with the political system and the security doctrines of states, where such religions dominate. **Short description of the course (in the language of instruction):** This course is an introduction to rational choice theory and its application as a method for analyzing political behavior, and for explaining political phenomena and processes more generally. It is intended for advanced, MA level students in political science. It offers an in-depth analysis of such already covered in their prior studies areas of politics as theory of the state, power and constitutional politics, political parties' and voters' behavior, conflict resolution, party competition, the characteristic features of bureaucracies and hierarchies, of fiscal and re-distributive policies, etc., which utilizes formal assumptions about political actors as rational utility-maximizers, and based on these assumptions builds explanatory models.

**Short description of the course (in the language of instruction):** This course analyses the nature, factors, mechanisms, consequences, prevention, and combating of corruption. The social roots and the contradictory nature of corruption are the main emphases in interpreting corruption. Special attention is given to the (post)totalitarian and the Mediterranean traditions in corruptive practices. The main goals of the course are (i) to throw light on the complex ways in which corruption pervades contemporary society, (ii) to dispel common illusions about corruption, and (iii) to systematize the main structural and practical obstacles for preventing and tackling corruption.
